Virtual School Expectations 2020 - 2021

SeeSaw will be utilized to deliver online content to students in grades PK-2 and Google Classroom for students in grades 3-6. Packets of work will be available for families as needed. **Student participation in classwork activities and assignments will be required and graded as designated by classroom teachers.**

- We will create differentiated assignments that align with the instruction from the regular classroom setting.

- We will address special education needs as required by a student's individualized education plan (IEP) according to Form G.
- We will communicate clear expectations of assignment deadlines and provide timely feedback when appropriate.

- We will identify a space in our home where we can work effectively and successfully
- We will engage in all learning with academic honesty
- We will complete and turn in ALL assignments by due dates
- We will check on our progress and grades in Powerschool
- We will communicate with our teachers if we require additional support
